5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 2, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
7	amended by adding Article 2.1305 to read as follows:
8	Art. 2.1305. CARRYING WEAPON ON CERTAIN PREMISES. (a) An
9	establishment serving the public may not prohibit or otherwise
10	restrict a peace officer or special investigator from carrying on
11	the establishment's premises a weapon that the peace officer or
12	special investigator is otherwise authorized to carry, regardless
13	of whether the peace officer or special investigator is engaged in
14	the actual discharge of the officer's or investigator's duties
15	while carrying the weapon.
16	(b) For purposes of this article:
17	(1) "Establishment serving the public" means:
18	(A) a hotel, motel, or other place of lodging;
19	(B) a restaurant or other place where food is
20	offered for sale to the public;
21	(C) a retail business or other commercial
22	establishment or an office building to which the general public is
23	<pre>invited;</pre>
24	(D) a sports venue; and

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(E) any other place of public accommodation, 1 2 amusement, convenience, or resort to which the general public or any classification of persons from the general public is regularly, 3 4 normally, or customarily invited. (2) "Sports venue" means an arena, coliseum, stadium, 5 6 or other type of area or facility that is primarily used or is planned for primary use for one or more professional or amateur 7 sports or athletics events and for which a fee is charged or is 8 planned to be charged for admission to the sports or athletics 9 events, other than occasional civic, charitable, or promotional 10 11 events. SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only 12 to conduct that occurs on or after the effective date of this Act. 13

14 Conduct that occurs before the effective date of this Act is 15 governed by the law in effect on the date the conduct occurred, and 16 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
