SECTION 2. Article 29.035, Code of Criminal Procedure, as 19 added by this Act, applies to a criminal action pending before a 20 21 trial court on or after the effective date of this Act, regardless of whether the offense that is the subject of the action was 22 23 committed before, on, or after the effective date of this Act. 24 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
