(a) 7 Subsection (b) applies to [In this chapter, a person is engaged in 8 the "business of structural pest control" if the person performs, 9 offers to perform, or advertises for or solicits the person's 10 performance of any of] the following services [for compensation, 11 12 including services performed as a part of the person's employment]: (1) identifying infestations or making inspections 13 14 for the purpose of identifying or attempting to identify infestations of: 15 16 (A) arthropods, including insects, spiders, mites, ticks, and related pests, wood-infesting organisms, 17 rodents, weeds, nuisance birds, and any other obnoxious or 18 undesirable animals that may infest households, railroad cars, 19 ships, docks, trucks, airplanes, or other structures or their 20 21 contents; or 22 (B) pests or diseases of trees, shrubs, or other 23 plantings in a park or adjacent to a residence, business

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establishment, industrial plant, institutional building, or

2 (2) making oral or written inspection reports,
3 recommendations, estimates, or bids with respect to an infestation
4 described by Subdivision (1); or

5 (3) making contracts, or submitting bids [based on an 6 inspection] for services or performing services designed to 7 prevent, control, or eliminate an infestation described by 8 Subdivision (1) by the use of insecticides, pesticides, 9 rodenticides, fumigants, allied chemicals or substances, or 10 mechanical devices.

11 (b) <u>A person is engaged in the "business of structural pest</u> 12 <u>control" and required to hold a license under this chapter if the</u> 13 <u>person:</u>

14 <u>(1) advertises or solicits to perform any service</u> 15 <u>described by Subsection (a); or</u>

16 (2) performs or offers to perform for compensation any 17 service described by Subsection (a), including a service performed 18 as part of the person's employment.

19 (c) A person is not engaged in the business of structural 20 pest control if the person is a clerical employee or a manual 21 laborer and the person does not:

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(1) identify pests;

(2) make inspections, recommendations, estimates,
 bids, or contracts;

(3) provide estimates, bids, or contracts based on an
 inspection; [<del>or</del>]

27 (4) apply insecticides, pesticides, rodenticides,

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fumigants, allied chemicals, or other related substances regulated
 by the department; or

3 (5) advertise or solicit to perform any service
4 described by Subsection (a).

5 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 6 conduct that occurs on or after the effective date of this Act. 7 Conduct that occurs before the effective date of this Act is 8 governed by the law in effect when the conduct occurs, and the 9 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
