7	section, "business entity" means any entity recognized by law

11	(b) A person may recover reasonable attorney's fees from an
12	individual, $[extit{or}]$ corporation, or business entity, in addition to
13	the amount of a valid claim and costs, if the claim is for:
14	(1) rendered services;
15	(2) performed labor;
16	(3) furnished material;
17	(4) freight or express overcharges;
18	(5) lost or damaged freight or express;
19	(6) killed or injured stock;
20	(7) a sworn account; or
21	(8) an oral or written contract.
22	SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
23	to an award of attorney's fees in an action commenced on or after

24 the effective date of this Act. An award of attorney's fees in an

- 1 action commenced before the effective date of this Act is governed
- 2 by the law applicable to the award immediately before the effective
- 3 date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that
- 4 purpose.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
