- 7 Code, is amended by adding Section 573.005 to read as follows:
- 8 <u>Sec. 573.005.</u> TRANSPORTATION FOR EMERGENCY DETENTION BY
- 9 EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES PROVIDER; MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING.
- 10 (a) A law enforcement agency and an emergency medical services
- 11 provider may execute a memorandum of understanding under which
- 12 emergency medical services personnel employed by the provider may
- 13 transport a person taken into custody under Section 573.001 by a
- 14 peace officer employed by the law enforcement agency.
- 15 (b) A memorandum of understanding must:
- 16 <u>(1) address responsibility for the cost of</u>
- 17 transporting the person taken into custody; and
- 18 (2) be approved by the county in which the law
- 19 enforcement agency is located and the local mental health authority
- 20 that provides services in that county with respect to provisions of
- 21 the memorandum that address the responsibility for the cost of
- 22 transporting the person.
- (c) A peace officer may request that emergency medical
- 24 services personnel transport a person taken into custody by the
- 25 officer under Section 573.001 only if:
- (1) the law enforcement agency that employs the
- 27 officer and the emergency medical services provider that employs

- 1 the personnel have executed a memorandum of understanding under
- 2 this section; and
- 3 (2) the officer determines that transferring the
- 4 person for transport is safe for both the person and the personnel.
- 5 (d) Emergency medical services personnel may, at the
- 6 request of a peace officer, transport a person taken into custody by
- 7 the officer under Section 573.001 to the appropriate facility, as
- 8 provided by that section, if the law enforcement agency that
- 9 employs the officer and the emergency medical services provider
- 10 that employs the personnel have executed a memorandum of
- 11 understanding under this section.
- 12 (e) A peace officer who transfers a person to emergency
- 13 medical services personnel under a memorandum of understanding
- 14 executed under this section for transport to the appropriate
- 15 facility must provide:
- 16 (1) to the person the notice described by Section
- 17 <u>573.001(g);</u> and
- 18 (2) to the personnel a completed notification of
- 19 detention about the person on the form provided by Section
- 20 573.002(d).
- 21 SECTION 5. Section 573.021(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 22 amended to read as follows:
- 23 (a) A facility shall temporarily accept a person for whom an
- 24 application for detention is filed or for whom a peace officer or
- 25 emergency medical services personnel of an emergency medical
- 26 services provider transporting the person in accordance with a
- 27 memorandum of understanding executed under Section 573.005 files a

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1	notification of detention completed by the peace officer under
2	Section 573.002(a).
3	SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
4	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
5	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
5	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
7	Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
