8	(a) The commission, in collaboration with the Texas Coordinating
9	Council for Veterans Services, the United States Department of
10	Veterans Affairs, the Service Members, Veterans, and Their Families
11	Technical Assistance Center Implementation Academy of the
12	Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration of the
13	United States Department of Health and Human Services, veteran
14	advocacy groups, medical providers, and any other organization or
15	interested party the commission considers appropriate, shall
16	develop a comprehensive action plan to increase access to and
17	availability of professional veteran health services to prevent
18	veteran suicides.
19	(b) The action plan must:
20	(1) identify opportunities for raising awareness of
21	and providing resources for veteran suicide prevention;
22	(2) identify opportunities to increase access to
23	<pre>veteran mental health services;</pre>
24	(3) identify funding resources to provide accessible,

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- 1 affordable veteran mental health services;
- 2 (4) provide measures to expand public-private
- 3 partnerships to ensure access to quality, timely mental health
- 4 services;
- 5 (5) provide for proactive outreach measures to reach
- 6 veterans needing care;
- 7 (6) provide for peer-to-peer service coordination,
- 8 including training, certification, recertification, and continuing
- 9 education for peer coordinators; and
- 10 (7) address suicide prevention awareness, measures,
- 11 and training regarding veterans involved in the justice system.
- 12 <u>(c)</u> The commission shall make specific short-term and
- 13 long-term statutory, administrative, and budget-related
- 14 recommendations to the legislature and the governor regarding the
- 15 policy initiatives and reforms necessary to implement the action
- 16 plan developed under this section. The short-term recommendations
- 17 <u>must include a plan for state implementation beginning not later</u>
- 18 than September 1, 2019. The initiatives and reforms in the
- 19 short-term plan must be fully implemented by September 1, 2021. The
- 20 long-term recommendations must include a plan for state
- 21 implementation beginning not later than September 1, 2021. The
- 22 <u>initiatives</u> and reforms in the long-term plan must be fully
- 23 implemented by September 1, 2027.
- 24 (d) The commission shall include in its strategic plan under
- 25 Chapter 2056 the plans for implementation of the short-term and
- 26 long-term recommendations under Subsection (c).
- 27 (e) This section expires September 1, 2027.
