- 15 municipal boundary of Kingsville;
- 16 (20) U.S. Highway 77 from its intersection with the
- 17 southern municipal boundary of Kingsville to its intersection with
- 18 State Highway 285 in Riviera; and
- 19 (21) State Highway 285 from its intersection with U.S.
- 20 Highway 77 in Riviera to its intersection with the eastern
- 21 municipal boundary of Hebbronville.
- 22 (h) In this section, a reference to a municipal boundary
- 23 means that boundary as it exists on September 1, 2017.
- 24 (i) A designation of highway segments as the Tom Lea Trail
- 25 may not be construed as a designation under the National Historic
- 26 Preservation Act (54 U.S.C. Section 300101 et seq.).
