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1 AN ACT relating to a study of seniors with a visual impairment by the Aging 2 3 Texas Well Advisory Committee. Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. (a) In this section, "advisory committee" means 5 6 the Aging Texas Well Advisory Committee. 7 (b) The executive commissioner of the Health and Human 8 Services Commission shall direct the advisory committee to assist the commission to: 9 10 (1) determine the appropriate level of independent living services for the growing number of seniors in the state with 11 12 visual impairment; and (2) make recommendations on the provision of services 13 14 to seniors described by Subdivision (1). 15 (c) Notwithstanding Chapter 551, Government Code, or any other law, in implementing its duties under this Act, the advisory 16 committee may meet by telephone conference call, videoconference, 17 or other similar telecommunication method. A meeting held by 18 telephone conference call, videoconference, or other similar 19 telecommunication method is subject to the requirements of Sections 20 551.125(c), (d), (e), and (f), Government Code. 21 22 (d) The advisory committee shall conduct a study to determine the projected growth and geographic distribution of 23 24 seniors with a visual impairment in the next 5 to 10 years and

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improving and expanding services, including 1 methods for 2 independent living services, to those seniors. The study must: (1) identify the barriers to expanding health care 3 4 services to seniors with a visual impairment; 5 (2) include methods for expanding coordination efforts with and involvement by public and private entities; 6 7 (3) recommend a training curriculum for state agency personnel who provide direct intervention and independent living 8 9 services to seniors with a visual impairment; 10 (4) identify and recommend a strategy to increase the 11 number of state agency personnel who provide direct intervention 12 and independent living services to seniors with a visual 13 impairment; and (5) determine 14 potential public and private 15 collaborators that provide services to seniors with a visual 16 impairment, including: 17 (A) assessing the current level of 18 collaboration; (B) identifying 19 the barriers preventing а 20 greater level of collaboration than the current level of 21 collaboration; 22 (C) identifying the methods, additional and additional benefits this state may offer to 23 incentives, increase collaboration, coordination, and partnerships; 24 25 (D) determining the role of public and private entities that provide services to persons with a visual impairment 26 27 who are not blind; and

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(E) establishing methods for incentivizing
private entities to provide services to seniors with a visual
impairment.

(e) 4 The advisory committee shall develop, in collaboration entities and other organizations that 5 with private assist individuals with a visual impairment, methods to publicize the 6 7 services available to seniors with a visual impairment. The Health and Human Services Commission may solicit and accept funding for 8 9 and contract with a private entity for implementing an advisory 10 committee recommendation under this subsection.

(f) The recommendations required by Subsection (b) of this section must be in the form of a new initiative, an immediate proposed regulatory change by a state agency, a proposed statutory amendment, or a suggested funding level.

(g) The advisory committee shall develop and submit a written report on the study, publicity methods, and recommendations developed by the advisory committee to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, and each member of the legislature not later than November 1, 2018.

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(h) This Act expires June 1, 2019.

21 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
