20	determined by the department to be medically underserved, including
21	the border region and rural areas.
22	(b) The department shall consult with health care
23	providers, advocacy groups, relevant federal agencies, and any
24	other interested persons the department considers necessary to

1 develop the action plan required by this section. 2 Sec. 1001.252. PLAN REQUIREMENTS. (a) The action plan 3 developed under Section 1001.251 must include: 4 (1) short-term and long-term plan recommendations, 5 including policy initiatives and reforms necessary to implement the 6 plan; 7 (2) statutory and administrative changes necessary to 8 implement the plan; and 9 (3) options for the funding necessary to implement the 10 plan. 11 (b) The department shall: 12 (1) not later than September 1, 2019: (A) submit to the governor and the legislature 13 14 the recommendations, the statutory and administrative changes, and the funding options described in Subsection (a) and short-term and 15 long-term plans to implement those recommendations, changes, and 16 17 options; and 18 (B) begin implementing the short-term plan; 19 (2) not later than September 1, 2021, fully implement 20 the short-term plan; 21 (3) not later than September 1, 2027, fully implement 22 the long-term plan; and 23 (4) include the short-term and long-term plans in the 24 material the department prepares for consideration of commission in connection with the update of the strategic plan for 25 26 health and human services under Section 531.022, Government Code.
