Senator Hinojosa moved that SB 546 do not pass but that CSSB 546 be reported back to the Senate with the recommendation that it do pass and be printed. The motion carried with a record vote of 6 ayes, 2 nays, 0 present not voting, and 1 absent. Senator West requested unanimous consent to be shown voting aye; without objection, it was so ordered.
