Relating to public hearing requirements for issuing a license for or expanding certain residential child-care facilities.

Relating to information regarding consumer access to health care records.

Relating to unlawful acts involving certain health care programs.

HB 4643 Dorazio SP: Hagenbuch
Relating to access to criminal history record information that relates to providers and provider applicants under Medicaid and other public benefits programs administered by the Health and Human Services Commission.

Relating to a report on governmental opioid antagonist programs to reverse and prevent opioid overdoses.
